Council members were asked to introduce themselves. The group sang "Happy Birthday" to Father Matthew, read the Mission Statement, and Jeanne offered the Opening Prayer. The prayer included the Scripture quote, "Do whatever he tells you."

Michele Konrad, vice-chair, explained the concept of "Circle Time." Circle Time offers an opportunity to speak freely in a safe environment. Participants are led by a facilitator and may speak only when they hold the "talking piece." There should be no negativity and confidentiality is required. The "Talking Piece" is passed and responses can be made when holding the "talking piece." The group participated in Circle Time using the theme of "Do whatever he tells you."

During Circle Time, our new Director of Youth Ministry, Jacqueline Guilbeault, joined us. Jacqueline is a graduate of Viterbo University where she majored in Spanish and Theology.

There was a short recess. The group enjoyed root beer floats and welcomed our new Pastoral Council members: Steve Heun, Kym Leibham, and Bea Van Geffen.

Jeanne circulated a document clarifying the role of the Finance Councils.

Pastors' Reports:

Father Matthew complimented the theme of the meeting, "Do whatever he tells you." He reported that Seminarian Raphael Roxas has returned to Loyola University in Chicago. The annual seminary dinner will be on September 28. A bus will be provided between Sheboygan and Milwaukee. With regard to staffing issues, church secretary Mary Petrie will work a reduced number of hours starting in January 2019. The role of Director of Administrative Services has been budgeted and will be discussed with the Finance Councils. A new member of the parish may take the role of coordinating R.C.I.A. Father encouraged everyone to listen to his homily on the website regarding the sex abuse scandal. We need to address the pain and sensitivity of all abuse, while calling for justice and accountability.

Father Gideon asked for prayers at this challenging moment for the church. He asked us to pray for the church, for priests, and for a deep sense of healing. He also reported that 55 parishioners went on a pilgrimage to the shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in La Crosse. It was a prayerful and peaceful day.

Old Business:

Laura Graney will give a progress report in September about the Refugee Immigrant Project. At that time the council can determine whether it should be sent to Human Concerns or to a subcommittee.

New Business:

The calendar for the year will be sent out. Generally, the meetings are the 4th Monday of the month with some exceptions.
